

Attention Engineering and Computer Science Students!

Mesa Community College, in partnership with Arizona State University and the National Science Foundation, is awarding up to \$1,000 S-STEM scholarships for the Fall 2019 Semester.

How do I qualify for the S-STEM?

In order for a student to qualify for a scholarship award you must satisfy the following criteria:

S-STEM Qualifications
• Financial Need as established by FAFSA
• Be U.S. Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Aliens admitted as Refugees
• Be enrolled as a full-time student at MCC (12 or more credit hours at MCC)
• Declared major in Engineering or Computer Science
• Enrolled for MAT 150 or higher (or completed College algebra or higher)
• Have a minimum 3.0 overall GPA

“Only those with a lawful presence in the US may qualify for MCCCCD scholarships or federal financial aid. Any information you provide about your legal status when you apply for financial aid or scholarships may be subject to mandatory reporting to federal immigration authorities under AZ law.”

What are the expectations of a S-STEM participant?

Each scholarship recipient is expected to complete the following activities during the Fall Semester:

- Participate in a scholarship orientation.
- Meet with faculty mentor a minimum of 2 times during the semester
- Complete four Scholarship Activities, including developing an individual resume and career plan, and complete three Scholarship Surveys during the course of the semester
- Participate in two STEM-related activities of your choosing during the semester
- Maintain full-time status (12 or more credit hours) and cumulative GPA of 3.0
